



## Academic Improvement Program

The Academic Improvement Program (AIP) is intended to assist students in extricating themselves from scholastic discipline and to meet the graduation requirement of a cumulative Georgia State University GPA of 2.0 or higher. The elements of AIP are registration approvals by an advisor, course load limits, and survival skills instruction.

Students are placed on:

- **Warning** when their cumulative Georgia State University GPA is below 2.0 and they were not on Supervision or Probation the previous semester in attendance. However, students on Warning who attempt 6 or more semester hours in the subsequent semester and earn a Georgia State term GPA of 2.3 or better will remain on Warning.
- **Supervision** when their cumulative Georgia State GPA is below 2.0 and they were on Warning the previous semester in attendance. However, students on Supervision who attempt 6 or more semester hours and earn a Georgia State term GPA of 2.3 or better will remain on Supervision.
- **Probation** when their cumulative Georgia State GPA is below 2.0 and they were on Supervision the previous semester in attendance. However, students on Probation who attempt 6 or more semester hours and earn a Georgia State term GPA of 2.3 or better will remain on Probation.
- **Exclusion** when their cumulative Georgia State University GPA is below a 2.0 and they were on Probation the previous semester in attendance. **Exclusion is permanent.** Students on Exclusion are not eligible to enroll in any undergraduate program or under any status at Georgia State. **No transfer credit will be accepted for courses taken at other institutions while on exclusion.**

All students that are placed on **Warning, Supervision, or Probation must:**

1. Have their registration approved by an advisor in the University Advisement Center or Office of Academic Assistance. If you have less than 90 hours, you must meet with an academic advisor in the University Advisement Center prior to registering for classes. If you have 90 hours or more; you must meet with an academic advisor in your college's office of academic assistance. The locations are listed below. Students should follow the academic advisement procedures for their chosen college as listed in the schedule of classes. Your college advisor's signature is required indicating the written approval of your class schedule. The advisor will review the AIP policies and advance the hold so that you can register for classes.
2. Take any other steps required by an advisor in the University Advisement Center or Office of Academic Assistance.
3. Register for a minimum 6 hours. Students are limited to 13 hours per term until they return to Good Standing (2.0 cumulative Georgia State University GPA). The maximum is 13 hours or less, if required by an advisor.
